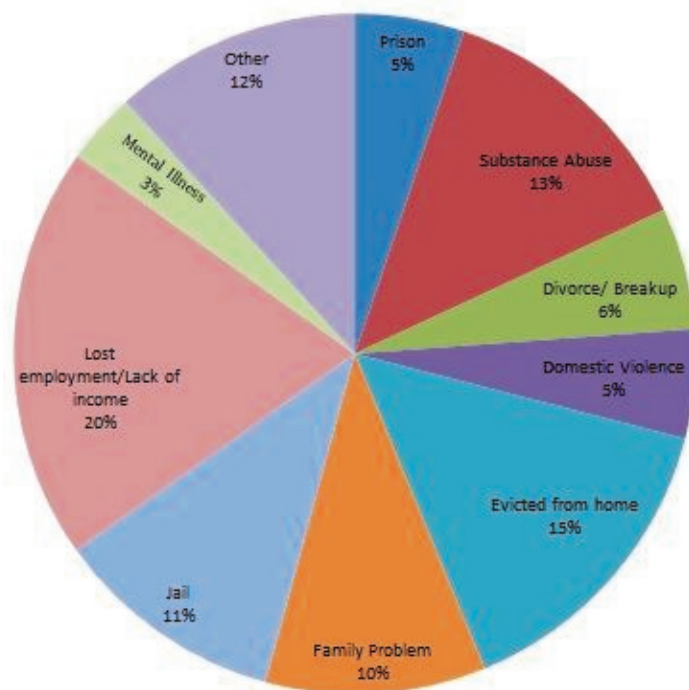
In 2017 there were **1554** people that received a service and were recorded into CC-HMIS. Out of those people there were:

**86** Veterans  
**346** Children  
**105** Experiencing Chronic Homelessness  
**769** New to CC-HMIS

In 2017 there were **148** families that were served.

**60%** of people that were exited from a program in 2017 went to Permanent Housing.

## Causes of Homelessness in 2017



In 2017 the average income of those experiencing homelessness that were employed was **\$1068.36** per month.

CC-HMIS has been in use since October 2010. Since operational there have been **8415** unique individuals from our community keyed into it.

CC-HMIS has the ability to store a photo for each person in the system. A barcoded photo ID card can then be printed. This provides ease of access to the system for providers and allows a person to have an initial ID.

### One System
