The Piedmont Columbus Regional Community Health Center specializes in general family medicine focusing on patients from 18-64 years of age. In order to be seen at the Community Health Center, you must contact the financial resource center for a list of all documents required to qualify for the program. Below are items that are required (please call for complete list).

- **Must show proof of residency in Muscogee County for at least three (3) months.**
- **Must have a Georgia identification card.**
- **Must have an employment agency wage statement.**

Please call 706.321.6690 for financial screening eligibility. You will be given an on-site appointment at the Financial Resource Center located inside the Professional Tower at 700 Center St. (see map on back).

Once approved for the program, patients will be able to receive routine office visits, preventative screening, lab work, medications and referrals to specialists when clinically indicated at NO COST.

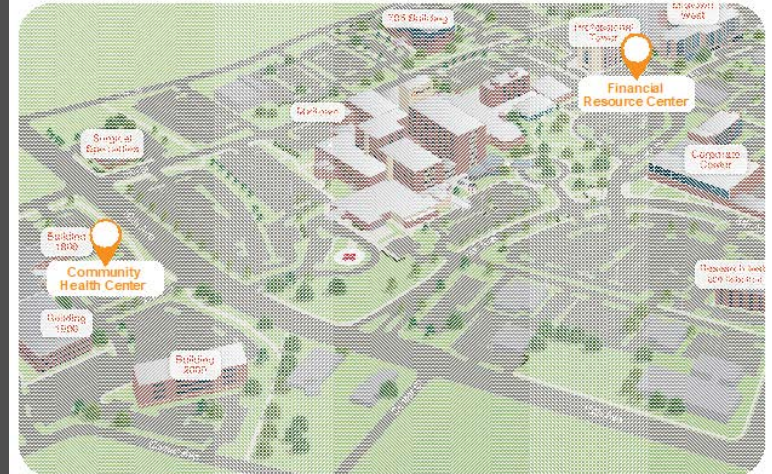
Specialty clinics include but are not limited to:

Homelessness and the Family System



HOMELESSNESS FACTS:

- Homelessness is a major issues in the United States.
- We have more homelessness in the United States than any other industrialized nation.
- Nationwide, homelessness has increased in the United States 85% in recent years.



Homelessness and Children

- One in thirty children experience homelessness every year, and 51% of those children are under the age of five years old.



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND HOMELESSNES

- Domestic violence is the immediate cause of homelessness for many women and children. Among families that reported domestic violence in the prior five years, 88 percent reported that it contributed to their homelessness a lot. ([National Alliance to End Homelessness](#))



OUR YOUTH AND HOMELESSNESS

- In America, up to 1.6 million youth experience homelessness each year. The statistics for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) homeless youth are even more shocking, as this group represents up to 40% all young people experiencing homelessness. Considering that LGBT youth represent an estimated 7% of the total youth population, these numbers are disproportionately high. ([The True Colors Fund](#))

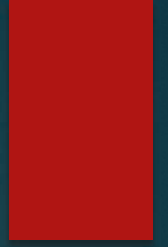


Prevalence of Mental Illness Among People Experiencing Homelessness in the U.S.?



- According to 2015 U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development research, 564,708 people were homeless on a given night in the United States.
- At a minimum, 140,000 or 25 percent of these people were seriously mentally ill, and 250,000 or 45 percent had any mental illness. In a comparison to a 2016 study, it was found that 4.2 percent of U.S. adults have been diagnosed with a serious mental illness.
